

CLINICAL CLASSES IN HOSPITALS - GENERAL GUIDELINES
(conditions for attending clinical classes
or entering a clinic for a preclinical course)

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

PPE is to be used by students in accordance with the internal procedures of the unit (clinic / department).

In addition to the above-mentioned PPE package, the student should have:

1. a short-sleeved white coat (max. an elbow length) ,
2. shoes easy to disinfect,

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

1. The student cannot wear jewellery / watch.
2. Short nails are required, no nail polish.
3. Long hair should be tied up.

The student who will not have all of the above-mentioned safety measures and will not meet the requirements for the lack of jewellery, short nails, nail polish, etc. will not be admitted to classes. It will result in an unjustified absence from classes.

COURSE OF CLASSES

1. In the cloakroom at the entrance, the student leaves their outer garments and puts on a clean short-sleeved white coat.
2. Personal items that are too large to fit in a pocket and food products should be left in the cloakroom or a seminar room. They cannot be brought into a clinic i.e. patient rooms, treatment rooms, diagnostic laboratories, etc.
3. Only students not wearing jewellery or watches on their hands and wrists, without any artificial substance on the nails (nail polish, hybrid) can join the classes. Private clothing under the white coat must also be short-sleeved.
4. The number of students entering the ward (to see the patient) is determined by the teacher (not the entire clinical group at the same time).

IN CASE OF INFECTION:

1. A student with symptoms of infection (increased temperature, cough, runny nose, sore throat etc.) is prohibited from entering the hospital and participating in clinical classes. At the same time, they are obliged to report this fact by phone, through the group representative or by e-mail to the teacher / course coordinator.
2. In the case of symptoms of infection that appear outside of classes, the student contacts their GP (lekarz POZ). A student is obliged to report about their medical recommendations by phone, through the group representative or by e-mail to the teacher / course coordinator.
The doctor's note should be sent by email to the Dean's Office within 5 working days.
3. In the case of symptoms of infection that appear during classes, the student immediately reports this fact to the teacher to get a permission to leave the Hospital.
